











OVERSEAS FACILITATORS

Professor Chris Oura:

Chris is currently a Professor in Veterinary Virology at the School of Veterinary Medicine, UWI. Chris is a qualified veterinary surgeon, has a PhD in Immunology and has many years research experience working predominantly on vector-borne viral and protozoal diseases. Chris has worked in many countries around the world including Mexico, Uganda, Kenya, Zimbabwe and South Africa. Before coming to the UWI-SVM in January 2012, Chris spent 8 years as head of the non-vesicular reference labs at the Pirbright Institute in the UK.

Professor Craig Stephen:

Prof. Stephen is Executive Director of the Canadian Wildlife Health
Cooperative. He is a professor at the Western College of Veterinary
Medicine at the University of Saskatchewan and a Clinical Professor at the
University of British Columbia School of Population and Public Health. He
holds adjunct appointments at 4 other Canadian universities. He was also
the founding director and president of the Centre for Coastal Health. He
received both his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine and Doctor of Philosophy
(Epidemiology) degrees from the Western College of Veterinary Medicine,
University of Saskatchewan. His doctoral work, conducted at the Pacific
Biological Station, focused upon the investigation of emerging diseases in

fish populations. His areas of expertise include the ecology of emerging diseases, health of marine and aquatic species, risk assessment, health surveillance, veterinary public health and associated health policy. He is sought after as a lecturer and invited speaker by human and animal health professionals. He has over 90 scientific and technical publications and has given over 100 invited or scientific presentations.
