PRESENTERS

Dr. Guyan Arscott is a Jamaican plastic surgeon, certified by the British Association Plastic Surgery and a Fellow of the Royal College Surgeons, Edinburgh. He was a clinical lecturer, University of Aberdeen, Scotland, 1986-1988; consultant plastic surgeon, Kingston Public Hospital, since 1988; consultant plastic surgeon, Bustamante Children's Hospital, since 1988; consultant plastic surgeon, University of the West Indies, since 1990. He is research coordinator and chief of the congenital facial cleft management team.

Dr. Matthew Brown, DVM, is the Senior Veterinarian with the Jamaica Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (JSPCA) and is an experienced companion animal practitioner. He is a former Veterinary Officer with the Veterinary Services Division.

Dr. Aldyth Buckland is an Associate lecturer in the Department of Community Health and Psychiatry, UWI and has her own Private Practice. She has Master Practitioner certifications in Neuro- Linguistic Programming, Hypnosis, Time Techniques, CORE Coaching and Emotional Freedom Techniques. Currently, she serves as the President of CCFP Ja, and Vice-President of the Association of General Practitioners of Jamaica.

Dr. Paul Cadogan is a veterinarian, a 1987 graduate of the Ontario Veterinary College, University of Guelph, Ontario, Canada working in private clinical practice covering with multiple species.
